THIS WEEK'S LESSON: STEALTHY



IN THE CAR:

Ask your child what they learned about this week on the drive home:

A ninja's greatest weapon isn't his sword or even his karate skills. It's his silence! Ninjas are disciplined enough to stay absolutely silent so they don't give themselves away. Fools let their mouths run free, stirring up trouble and drawing attention to themselves. Kids will learn that there is great value in training the tongue. Proverbs 15:1-7



HANGING OUT:

Make this week's lesson real:

Encourage your kids to pause and think before they speak this week. How does stopping to think about your words every time change the way you speak?



AT DINNER:

Here are some great discussion starters:

- How do foolish words hurt other people?
- How can we use our tongues in a positive way?
- What is one thing we can do to tame our tongues?



AT BEDTIME:

Quiz your child on this week's memory verse:

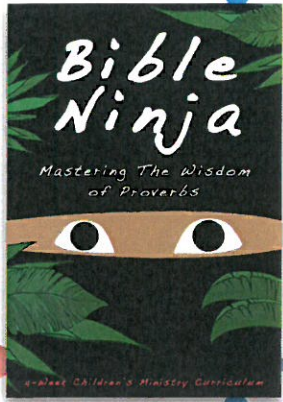
"Having respect for the Lord leads to life. Then you will be content and free from trouble." Proverbs 19:23 NIRV

IN THE CAR:

Ask your child what they learned about this week on the drive home:

Ninjas, like all martial artists, become successful because they learn from their teachers. They respect their masters and seek out wisdom. Fools trust only in their own ideas. Kids will learn that there is great value in following the wise instruction of others.

HANGING OUT:

Make this week's lesson real:

Share some wisdom that you gained from a parent, teacher, or coach when you were a kid. Share with your kids if you still have any mentors helping you to grow and learn to this day.



AT DINNER:

Here are some great discussion starters:

- Why is it important to listen to the wisdom of other people?
- Who are some of the "masters" God has given you to teach you wisdom?
- What are some wise things you have learned from adults?



AT BEDTIME:

Quiz your child on this week's memory verse:

PARENT TIME:

What you need to know:
